Main Economic Indicators

Every month, the OECD produces short-term economic indicators for its 30 member countries and a number of non-member countries including Brazil, China, India, the Russian Federation and South Africa. They provide an overview of recent international economic developments through the presentation of numerous comparable indicators in key areas such as international trade, balance of payments, construction, retail, earnings, interest rates etc. It is an essential tool for professional analysis for corporate planners, economists, academics, and researchers, as well as students, in a variety of fields and can be accessed in print, CD-ROM and online database versions.

OECD Economic Surveys



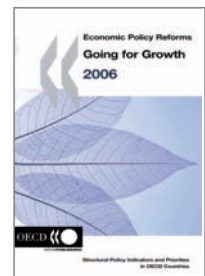
The OECD produces highly sought-after reviews of individual countries' economies. An *Economic Survey* is published every eighteen months to two years for each OECD country and for some larger countries that are not members of the OECD, such as China, Russia and Brazil. Each issue provides a solid analysis of developments in the subject country, special reports on topics of current interest, and extensive statistical information. *OECD Economic Surveys* are reference tools for governments, businesses, academics and NGOs. They are often used in teaching undergraduates.

National Accounts of OECD Countries

National accounts - the measurement of national income and output - are produced on a quarterly and annual basis for OECD member countries. *Annual National Accounts* statistics are presented in four volumes: *Main Aggregates*; *Detailed Tables*; *Financial Accounts and General Government Accounts*. The first volume, *Main Aggregates*, gives an overview by concentrating on core indicators such as gross domestic product (GDP), disposable income, saving, and net lending. The second volume goes into more detail and the third and fourth concentrate on specific accounts. *Quarterly National Accounts* contains a selection of the accounts most widely used by economic analysts. The data is available in print and CD-ROM versions or through access to the online databases.

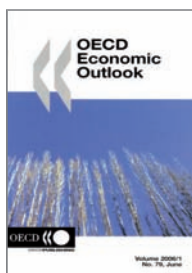
Economic Policy Reforms: Going for Growth

Economic Policy Reforms: Going for Growth is an annual periodical which highlights developments in structural policies in OECD countries. Closely related to the *OECD Economic Outlook* and *OECD Economic Surveys*, each issue gives an overview of structural policy developments in OECD countries followed by a set of indicators that reflect structural policy evolution. A set of country notes summarises priorities suggested by the indicators with actions taken and recommendations suggested. Each issue also includes thematic studies on topics related to the overall theme of the issue.



OECD Economic Outlook

Twice a year, the OECD publishes its *Economic Outlook*, which contains projections for a number of key economic variables over a two to two and a half-year horizon. These projections are accompanied by analysis including chapters on the economic conditions and prospects in individual OECD member countries and selected non-member economies, and on topics of current interest in economic policy debates, along with a rich statistical annex. Summary statistics and projections are included for developments in non-member economies, in particular in Central and Eastern Europe as well as in selected Asian and Latin American economies. A database is also available presenting the detailed indicators appearing in the *Economic Outlook*, which can be accessed online or on CD-ROM.
